- A worker who is currently working or has worked in the last 12 months doing agricultural work that is seasonal or temporary.
- Some of them may be migrant workers, students or H2A workers
- In Idaho the majority are Latino and many are ELLs.

Familia - Family includes nuclear and extended family - Strong feelings of loyalty and reciprocity - Needs of the group supersede the needs of individual
